


By 2030, older adults will make up 27% of the population in Lake County, outnumbering children.


Lack of a high school diploma is a barrier to employment, while those with at least a Bachelor's degree are generally the most viable in the labor market.






Poverty Rate by Age Group






SNAP (Food Stamps) - Nutritional Support






