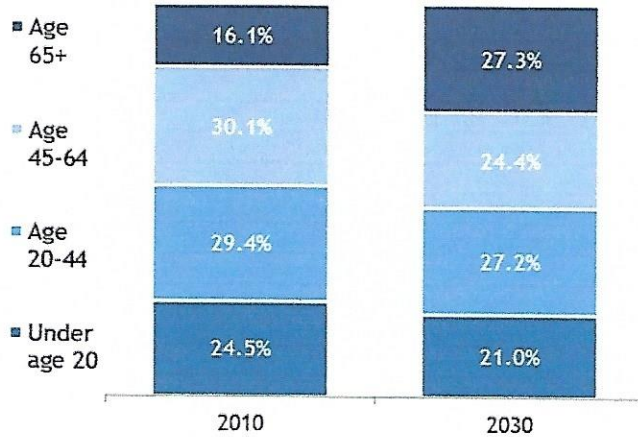

Demographic Projection

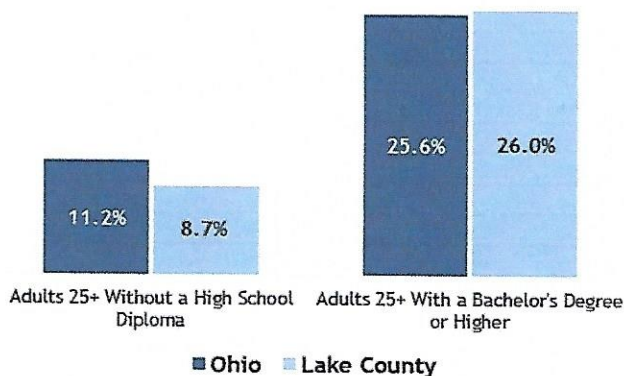
By 2030, older adults will make up 27% of the population in Lake County, outnumbering children.

Uninsured Rate

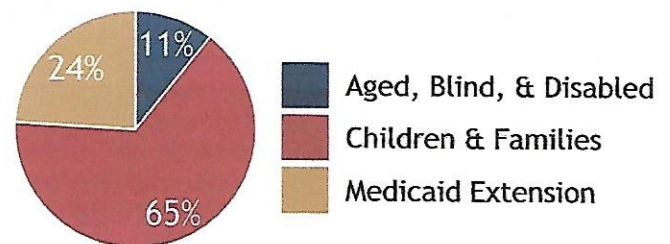

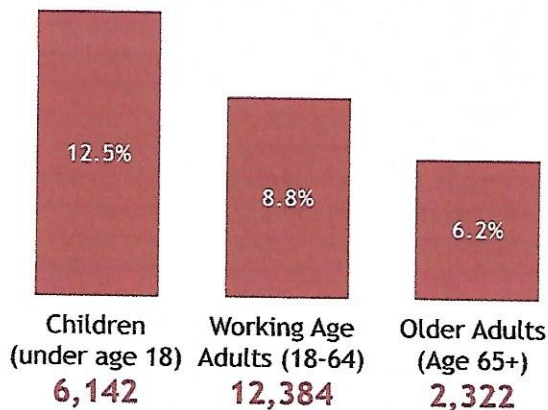

20,848 people, or 9.2% of people in Lake County, lived below poverty from 2010-2014..

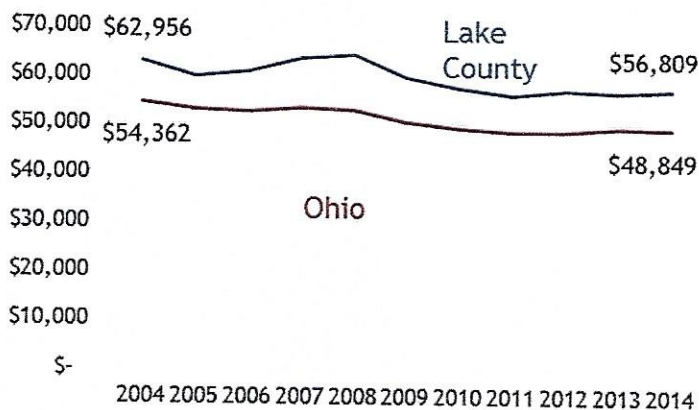
Poverty Rate by Age Group

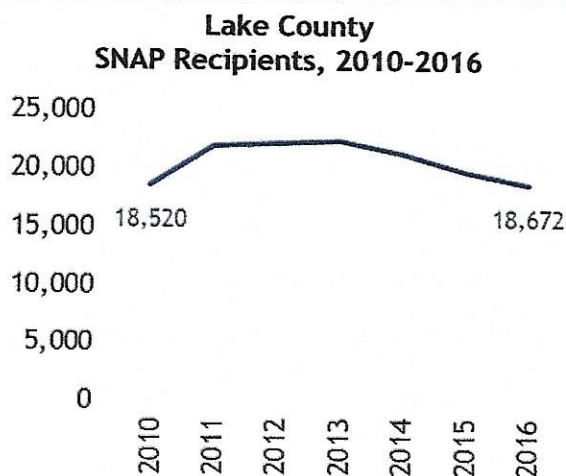
The Safety Net

8% of total Lake population receives SNAP benefits

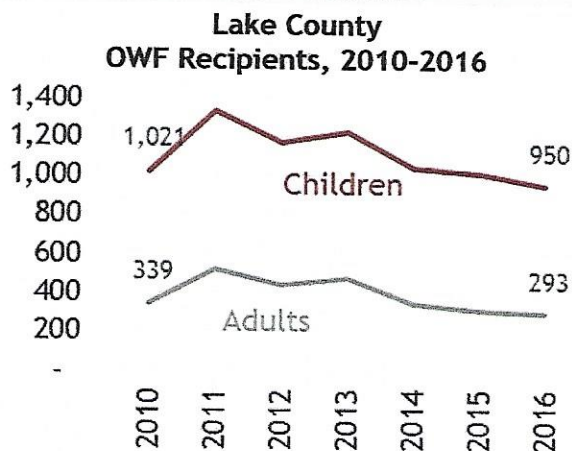
