

The median earned income for women is **\$33,823**. On average, women earn **\$0.74** of every dollar that men earn in Knox County, and half of working women earn even less.






### **Health & Wellness Indicators**

Women in the county **have** access to a safety net health center that is community-based and provides services to all residents, including those without insurance.




### **Maternal Health**
