



## **NEW POLL: 78% disapprove of DeWine’s Response to Coronavirus**

### **The People Are Exhausted with DeWine & Company Pushing Failed Lockdowns**

**02/23/2021, Ohio** – A new poll has revealed precisely how badly the Republican base feels DeWine is handling the response to COVID-19. For months Ohio Stands Up! has been asking why Mike DeWine is governing against the will of his base and why Jane Timken has been supporting this. There does not appear to be an answer to this question but this poll makes it clear that it is not going well.

The poll of Republican primary voters shows that nearly 78% disapprove of DeWine’s response to coronavirus and nearly 85% do not believe the stay-at-home orders and business restrictions are effective at preventing the spread of coronavirus. To further back up the dissatisfaction with what is happening, when asked what the most important issues facing Ohio are beyond coronavirus, by an overwhelming majority, the top four responses were government overreach, jobs, DeWine, and the economy. It goes without saying that all four of these indicate the complete failure of the administration in its response to COVID-19.

“Governor DeWine, with the help of his cronies, has spent nearly a year lying about COVID-19 and destroying Ohio’s families and economy – the people are done” says Attorney Thomas Renz.

As if all of this weren’t bad enough, DeWine and his health department have now decided create further divisions between the people of Ohio by promoting a racist and discriminatory series of townhalls. These townhalls are actually being broken down and targeted towards African Americans, Hispanic American, Asian and Pacific Islander Americans, and rural Ohioans. We find this racist approach to public health abhorrent and assume that the Governor has not gotten the memo that racism is NEVER acceptable and separate but equal is never truly equal.

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## **Ohio Republican Primary Voters - Governor Approval, Economy, and GOP Leadership Poll**

**December 2020**

### **Methodology**

Interviews were conducted December 3<sup>rd</sup> through December 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020 among a random sample of 1,020 Ohio Republican Primary voters contacted via cellphones and online panel.

Interviewees were randomly selected from a statewide voter file of registered Ohio GOP Primary Voters using a probability proportionate to size method, which means results are proportionally representative to the number of voters in all regions across the state.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of  $\pm 2.5$  percentage points.

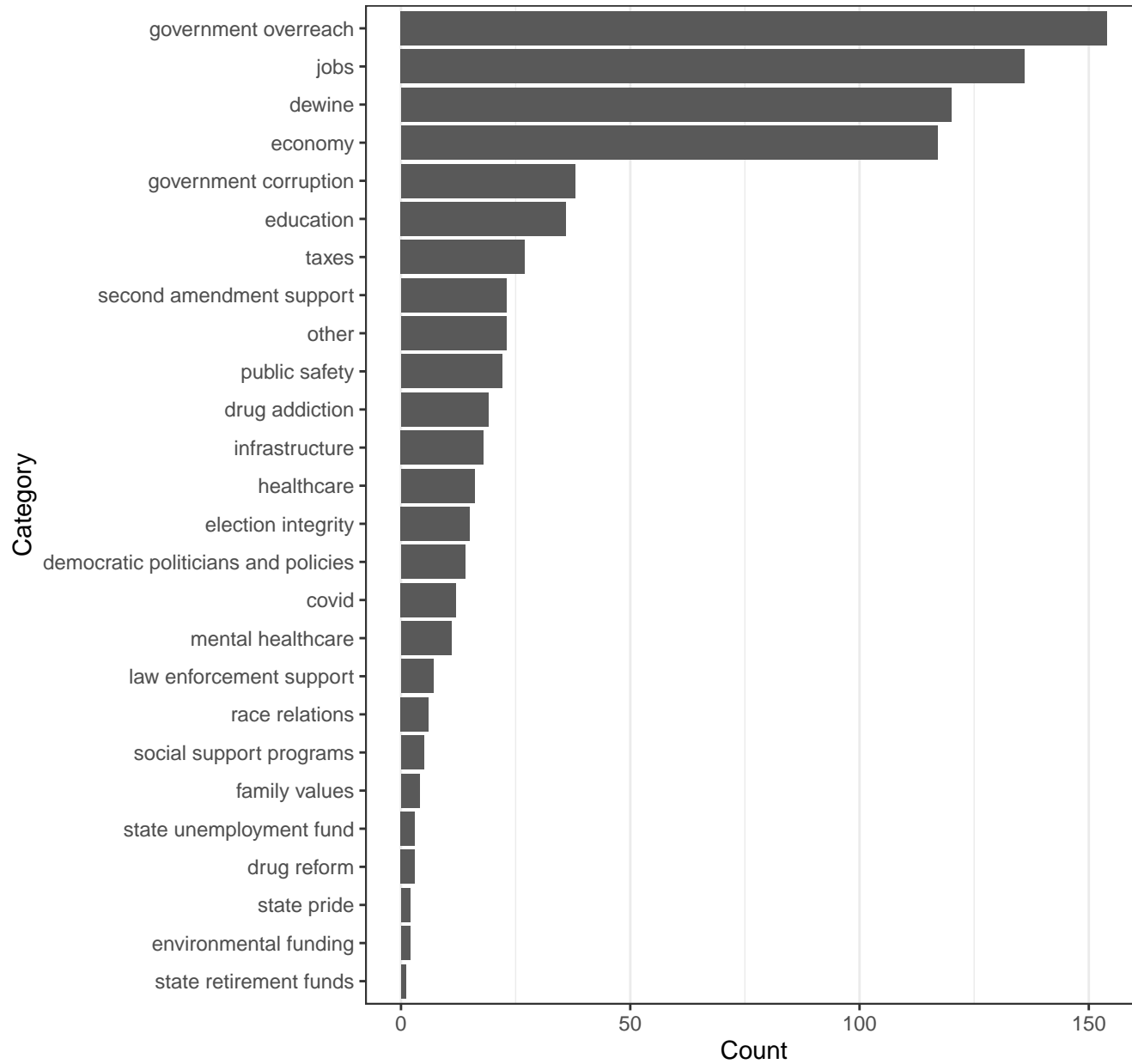
