

Research has shown that people with lower education attainment are more likely to struggle to find employment, and have poor health outcomes, compared to their more educated peers.





By 2020, older adults will make up 28% of the population in the county, outnumbering children and teens.


# Lake Population Projections, by Age Group

### Poverty in perspective:

For a family of three (single parent, two kids) in Lake County, the living wage is \$54,286 per year, more than three times what someone making minimum wage earns working 40 hours a week.

## **SNAP (Food Stamps) – Nutritional Support**




#### **Lake County** SNAP Recipients, 2010-2018


### Ohio Works First (OWF) - Cash Assistance

#### **Lake County OWF Recipients, 2010-2018**



As of May, 2018, 36,659 individuals in Lake County are enrolled in Medicaid, accounting for 16% of the total population.








### **Substance Use Disorders**

Drug overdoses have **sharply increased** in recent years, which has had a profound impact on Ohio. While this growth is driven mostly by the **opioid crisis**, most other substance categories have also seen increases. And while drug overdose-related ER visits have risen dramatically, many individuals who overdose do not seek medical care.

Ohio's **infant mortality** rate is higher than the nation's. Infant mortality **disproportionately impacts black babies**, who are nearly twice as likely as white babies to die before their first birthday.
