
Prevention Programs

Number of Presentations Given FY 2017-FY 2020



- A total of 6,701 presentations/trainings were given from FY 2017-FY2020.
- Almost 200,000 people were reached in those four years.
- Due to COVID-19, there were only 150 less presentations given in 2020. Most programs were presented using virtual platforms.

Presentations Given Within Schools FY 2019-FY 2020:

- > Total of 638 presentations/trainings were given within schools.
- > Provided presentations/training within ten school districts and fifteen private schools.
- **Reached over 6,900 students from pre-kindergarten to 12th grade.**

Topics Provider Agencies Present On:

<u>Crossroads Health</u>: social and emotional learning, kindness, empowerment, anti-bullying, internet safety, mental health, suicide prevention, and substance use.

<u>Crossroads Early Childhood</u>: social, emotional and academic competencies such as understanding and communicating feelings, using effective problem solving strategies, managing anger, practicing friendship and conversational skills, as well as appropriate classroom behaviors.

Family Planning Association, Signature Health: life skills, healthy relationships, sexual health.

<u>WomenSafe</u>: domestic violence (signs and support), abuse, boundaries, healthy relationships, skill building.

<u>NAMI</u>: mental health, dual diagnoses (mental health and substance use).

<u>Lake-Geauga Recover Centers</u>: substance use, problemgambling, problem-gaming, suicide prevention.

<u>Catholic Charities</u>: behavioral health resources and guidance to the Latinx population.

Highlights of some of the actions taken the past couple of years:

- ADAMHS provided education and support for the Domestic Relations Pro Bono Court.
- ADAMHS works closely with Lakeland Community College re: Mental Health Education and Suicide Prevention. The ADAMHS Board assisted Lakeland Community College in developing the Reach Out app, which provides quick access to guidance for supporting a friend in need, suicide prevention, and coping with mental health challenges.
- ADAMHS has worked with various churches, businesses, local agencies, neighborhood gatherings and educational institutes to provide training and education.
- ADAMHS has provided Operation Resolve trainings for local businesses.
- ADAMHS Outreach Specialist and provider agencies continue to be a part of community initiatives, including the Safe Communities Coalition, Crime Prevention Coalition, Sexual Assault Response Team, Tobacco Use Prevention Coalition, Back to School Bash Committee, and more.
