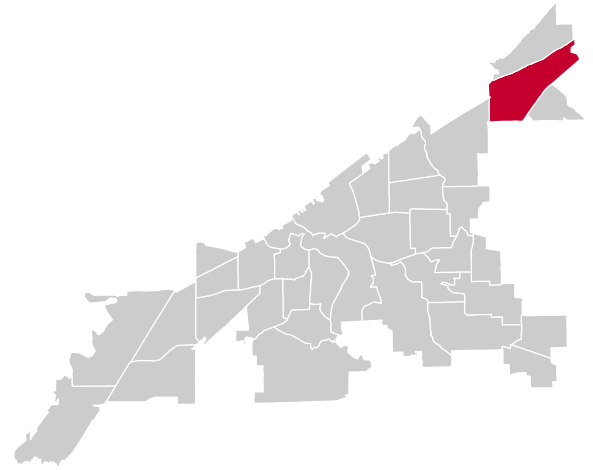

Food Bank Benefits Eligibility



2 in 3 Collinwood-Nottingham residents, 6,853 total, live at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level, which means they are eligible to receive food bank benefits.

Internet Access
