3509.11 of the Revised Code to create a	3
permanent absent voter list.	4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 3501.05, 3501.11, 3503.14,	5
3503.20, and 3503.28 be amended and section 3509.11 of the	6
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	7
Sec. 3501.05. The secretary of state shall do all of the	8
following:	9
(A) Appoint all members of boards of elections;	10
(B) Issue instructions by directives and advisories in	11
accordance with section 3501.053 of the Revised Code to members	12
of the boards as to the proper methods of conducting elections.	13
(C) Prepare rules and instructions for the conduct of	14
elections;	15
(D) Publish and furnish to the boards from time to time a	16

force;

(E) Edit and issue all pamphlets concerning proposed laws 19 or amendments required by law to be submitted to the voters; 20 (F) Prescribe the form of registration cards, blanks, and 21 records; 22 (G) Determine and prescribe the forms of ballots and the 23 forms of all blanks, cards of instructions, pollbooks, tally 24 sheets, certificates of election, and forms and blanks required 25 by law for use by candidates, committees, and boards; 26 (H) Prepare the ballot title or statement to be placed on 27 28 the ballot for any proposed law or amendment to the constitution to be submitted to the voters of the state; 29 (I) Except as otherwise provided in section 3519.08 of the 30 Revised Code, certify to the several boards the forms of ballots 31 and names of candidates for state offices, and the form and 32 wording of state referendum questions and issues, as they shall 33 appear on the ballot; 34 (J) Except as otherwise provided in division (I)(2)(b) of 35 section 3501.38 of the Revised Code, give final approval to 36 ballot language for any local question or issue approved and 37 transmitted by boards of elections under section 3501.11 of the 38 Revised Code; 39 (K) Receive all initiative and referendum petitions on 40 state questions and issues and determine and certify to the 41 sufficiency of those petitions; 42

(L) Require such reports from the several boards as areprovided by law, or as the secretary of state considers44

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necessary;

(M) Compel the observance by election officers in theseveral counties of the requirements of the election laws;47

(N) (1) Except as otherwise provided in division (N) (2) of
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this section, investigate the administration of election laws,
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frauds, and irregularities in elections in any county, and
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report violations of election laws to the attorney general or
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prosecuting attorney, or both, for prosecution;
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(2) On and after August 24, 1995, report a failure to 53 comply with or a violation of a provision in sections 3517.08 to 54 3517.13, 3517.20 to 3517.22, 3599.03, or 3599.031 of the Revised 55 Code, whenever the secretary of state has or should have 56 knowledge of a failure to comply with or a violation of a 57 provision in one of those sections, by filing a complaint with 58 the Ohio elections commission under section 3517.153 of the 59 Revised Code. 60

(0) Make an annual report to the governor containing the
felections, the cost of elections in the various
counties, a tabulation of the votes in the several political
subdivisions, and other information and recommendations relative
to elections the secretary of state considers desirable;

(P) Prescribe and distribute to boards of elections a list
of instructions indicating all legal steps necessary to petition
successfully for local option elections under sections 4301.32
to 4301.41, 4303.29, 4305.14, and 4305.15 of the Revised Code;

(Q) Adopt rules pursuant to Chapter 119. of the Revised
Code for the removal by boards of elections of ineligible voters
from the statewide voter registration database and, if
applicable, from the poll list or signature pollbook used in
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74 each precinct, which rules shall provide for all of the 75 following: (1) A process for the removal of voters who have changed 76 residence, which shall be uniform, nondiscriminatory, and in 77 compliance with the Voting Rights Act of 1965 and the National 78 Voter Registration Act of 1993, including a program that uses 79 the national change of address service provided by the United 80 States postal system through its licensees; 81 (2) A process for the removal of ineligible voters under 82 section 3503.21 of the Revised Code; 83 84 (3) A uniform system for marking or removing the name of a voter who is ineligible to vote from the statewide voter 85 registration database and, if applicable, from the poll list or 86 signature pollbook used in each precinct and noting the reason 87 for that mark or removal. 88 (R) Prescribe a general program for registering voters or 89 updating voter registration information, such as name and 90 residence changes, by boards of elections, designated agencies, 91 offices of deputy registrars of motor vehicles, public high 92 schools and vocational schools, public libraries, and offices of 93 county treasurers consistent with the requirements of section 94 3503.09 of the Revised Code; 95

(S) Prescribe a program of distribution of voter
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registration forms through boards of elections, designated
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agencies, offices of the registrar and deputy registrars of
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motor vehicles, public high schools and vocational schools,
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public libraries, and offices of county treasurers;

(T) To the extent feasible, provide copies, at no cost andupon request, of the voter registration form in post offices in102

(U) Adopt rules pursuant to section 111.15 of the Revised Code for the purpose of implementing the program for registering voters through boards of elections, designated agencies, and the offices of the registrar and deputy registrars of motor vehicles consistent with this chapter;

(V) Establish the full-time position of Americans with 109 Disabilities Act coordinator within the office of the secretary 110 of state to do all of the following: 111

(1) Assist the secretary of state with ensuring that there is equal access to polling places for persons with disabilities;

(2) Assist the secretary of state with ensuring that each 114 voter may cast the voter's ballot in a manner that provides the 115 same opportunity for access and participation, including privacy 116 and independence, as for other voters;

(3) Advise the secretary of state in the development of 118 standards for the certification of voting machines, marking 119 devices, and automatic tabulating equipment. 120

(W) Establish and maintain a computerized statewide 121 database of all legally registered voters under section 3503.15 122 of the Revised Code that complies with the requirements of the 123 "Help America Vote Act of 2002," Pub. L. No. 107-252, 116 Stat. 124 1666, and provide training in the operation of that system; 125

(X) Ensure that all directives, advisories, other 126 instructions, or decisions issued or made during or as a result 127 of any conference or teleconference call with a board of 128 elections to discuss the proper methods and procedures for 129 conducting elections, to answer questions regarding elections, 130 or to discuss the interpretation of directives, advisories, or 131

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other instructions issued by the secretary of state are posted132on a web site of the office of the secretary of state as soon as133is practicable after the completion of the conference or134teleconference call, but not later than the close of business on135the same day as the conference or teleconference call takes136place.137

(Y) Publish a report on a web site of the office of the 138 secretary of state not later than one month after the completion 139 of the canvass of the election returns for each primary and 140 general election, identifying, by county, the number of absent 141 voter's ballots cast and the number of those ballots that were 142 counted, and the number of provisional ballots cast and the 143 number of those ballots that were counted, for that election. 144 The secretary of state shall maintain the information on the web 145 site in an archive format for each subsequent election. 146

(Z) Conduct voter education outlining voter
identification, absent voters ballot, provisional ballot, and
other voting requirements;

(AA) Establish a procedure by which a registered elector
may make available to a board of elections a more recent
signature to be used in the poll list or signature pollbook
produced by the board of elections of the county in which the
elector resides;

(BB) Disseminate information, which may include all or 155 part of the official explanations and arguments, by means of 156 direct mail or other written publication, broadcast, or other 157 means or combination of means, as directed by the Ohio ballot 158 board under division (F) of section 3505.062 of the Revised 159 Code, in order to inform the voters as fully as possible 160 concerning each proposed constitutional amendment, proposed law, 161

or referendum;

(CC) Be the single state office responsible for the 163 implementation of the "Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee 164 Voting Act," Pub. L. No. 99-410, 100 Stat. 924, 42 U.S.C. 165 1973ff, et seq., as amended, in this state. The secretary of 166 state may delegate to the boards of elections responsibilities 167 for the implementation of that act, including responsibilities 168 arising from amendments to that act made by the "Military and 169 Overseas Voter Empowerment Act," Subtitle H of the "National 170 Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2010," Pub. L. No. 171 111-84, 123 Stat. 3190. 172

(DD) Adopt rules, under Chapter 119. of the Revised Code, 173 to establish procedures and standards for determining when a 174 board of elections shall be placed under the official oversight 175 of the secretary of state, placing a board of elections under 176 the official oversight of the secretary of state, a board that 177 is under official oversight to transition out of official 178 oversight, and the secretary of state to supervise a board of 179 elections that is under official oversight of the secretary of 180 181 state.

(EE) Perform other duties required by law. 182

Whenever a primary election is held under section 3513.32 183 of the Revised Code or a special election is held under section 184 3521.03 of the Revised Code to fill a vacancy in the office of 185 representative to congress, the secretary of state shall 186 establish a deadline, notwithstanding any other deadline 187 required under the Revised Code, by which any or all of the 188 following shall occur: the filing of a declaration of candidacy 189 and petitions or a statement of candidacy and nominating 190 petition together with the applicable filing fee; the filing of 191

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protests against the candidacy of any person filing a 192 declaration of candidacy or nominating petition; the filing of a 193 declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate; the filing of 194 campaign finance reports; the preparation of, and the making of 195 corrections or challenges to, precinct voter registration lists; 196 the receipt of applications for absent voter's ballots or 197 uniformed services or overseas absent voter's ballots; the 198 supplying of election materials to precincts by boards of 199 elections; the holding of hearings by boards of elections to 200 consider challenges to the right of a person to appear on a 201 voter registration list; and the scheduling of programs to 202 instruct or reinstruct election officers. 203

In the performance of the secretary of state's duties as 204 the chief election officer, the secretary of state may 205 administer oaths, issue subpoenas, summon witnesses, compel the 206 production of books, papers, records, and other evidence, and 207 fix the time and place for hearing any matters relating to the 208 administration and enforcement of the election laws. 209

In any controversy involving or arising out of the 210 adoption of registration or the appropriation of funds for 211 registration, the secretary of state may, through the attorney 212 general, bring an action in the name of the state in the court 213 of common pleas of the county where the cause of action arose or 214 in an adjoining county, to adjudicate the question. 215

In any action involving the laws in Title XXXV of the 216 Revised Code wherein the interpretation of those laws is in 217 issue in such a manner that the result of the action will affect 218 the lawful duties of the secretary of state or of any board of 219 elections, the secretary of state may, on the secretary of 220 state's motion, be made a party. 221

The secretary of state may apply to any court that is 222 hearing a case in which the secretary of state is a party, for a 223 change of venue as a substantive right, and the change of venue 224 shall be allowed, and the case removed to the court of common 225 pleas of an adjoining county named in the application or, if 226 there are cases pending in more than one jurisdiction that 227 involve the same or similar issues, the court of common pleas of 228 Franklin county. 229

Public high schools and vocational schools, public230libraries, and the office of a county treasurer shall implement231voter registration programs as directed by the secretary of232state pursuant to this section.233

The secretary of state may mail unsolicited applications 234 for absent voter's ballots to individuals only for a general 235 election and only if the general assembly has made an 236 appropriation for that particular mailing. Under no other 237 circumstance shall a public office, or a public official or 238 employee who is acting in an official capacity, mail unsolicited 239 applications for absent voter's ballots to any individuals. An 240 application for absent voter's ballots mailed under section 241 3509.11 of the Revised Code is not considered an unsolicited 242 application. 243

Sec. 3501.11. Each board of elections shall exercise by a 244 majority vote all powers granted to the board by Title XXXV of 245 the Revised Code, shall perform all the duties imposed by law, 246 and shall do all of the following: 247

(A) Establish, define, provide, rearrange, and combine248election precincts;249

(B) Fix and provide the places for registration and for

holding primaries and elections;

(C) Provide for the purchase, preservation, and
maintenance of booths, ballot boxes, books, maps, flags, blanks,
cards of instructions, and other forms, papers, and equipment
used in registration, nominations, and elections;

(D) Appoint and remove its director, deputy director, and
 employees and all registrars, precinct election officials, and
 other officers of elections, fill vacancies, and designate the
 ward or district and precinct in which each shall serve;

(E) Make and issue rules and instructions, not
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inconsistent with law or the rules, directives, or advisories
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issued by the secretary of state, as it considers necessary for
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the guidance of election officers and voters;
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(F) Advertise and contract for the printing of all ballots and other supplies used in registrations and elections;

(G) Provide for the issuance of all notices,
advertisements, and publications concerning elections, except as
otherwise provided in division (G) of section 3501.17 and
divisions (F) and (G) of section 3505.062 of the Revised Code;
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(H) Provide for the delivery of ballots, pollbooks, and 270other required papers and material to the polling places; 271

(I) Cause the polling places to be suitably provided with 272 voting machines, marking devices, automatic tabulating 273 equipment, stalls, and other required supplies. In fulfilling 274 this duty, each board of a county that uses voting machines, 275 marking devices, or automatic tabulating equipment shall conduct 276 a full vote of the board during a public session of the board on 277 the allocation and distribution of voting machines, marking 278 279 devices, and automatic tabulating equipment for each precinct in

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the county.

(J) Investigate irregularities, nonperformance of duties,
or violations of Title XXXV of the Revised Code by election
officers and other persons; administer oaths, issue subpoenas,
summon witnesses, and compel the production of books, papers,
records, and other evidence in connection with any such
investigation; and report the facts to the prosecuting attorney
or the secretary of state;

(K) (1) Review, examine, and certify the sufficiency and 288 validity of petitions and nomination papers, and, after 289 certification, return to the secretary of state all petitions 290 and nomination papers that the secretary of state forwarded to 291 the board; 292

(2) Examine each initiative petition, or a petition filed 293 under section 307.94 or 307.95 of the Revised Code, received by 294 the board to determine whether the petition falls within the 295 scope of authority to enact via initiative and whether the 296 petition satisfies the statutory prerequisites to place the 297 298 issue on the ballot, as described in division (M) of section 3501.38 of the Revised Code. The petition shall be invalid if 299 any portion of the petition is not within the initiative power. 300

(L) Receive the returns of elections, canvass the returns, make abstracts of them, and transmit those abstracts to the proper authorities;

(M) Issue certificates of election on forms to be304prescribed by the secretary of state;305

(N) Make an annual report to the secretary of state, on
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the form prescribed by the secretary of state, containing a
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statement of the number of voters registered, elections held,
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votes cast, appropriations received, expenditures made, and	309
other data required by the secretary of state;	310
(O) Prepare and submit to the proper appropriating officer	311
a budget estimating the cost of elections for the ensuing fiscal	312
year;	313
(P) Perform other duties as prescribed by law or the	314
rules, directives, or advisories of the secretary of state;	315
(Q) Investigate and determine the residence qualifications	316
of electors;	317
(R) Administer oaths in matters pertaining to the	318
administration of the election laws;	319
(S) Prepare and submit to the secretary of state, whenever	320
the secretary of state requires, a report containing the names	321
and residence addresses of all incumbent county, municipal,	322
township, and board of education officials serving in their	323
respective counties;	324
(T) Establish and maintain a voter registration database	325
of all qualified electors in the county who offer to register;	326
(U) Maintain voter registration records, make reports	327
concerning voter registration as required by the secretary of	328
state, and remove ineligible electors from voter registration	329
lists in accordance with law and directives of the secretary of	330
state;	331
(V) Give approval to ballot language for any local	332
question or issue and transmit the language to the secretary of	333
state for the secretary of state's final approval;	334
(W) Prepare and cause the following notice to be displayed	335
in a prominent location in every polling place:	336

"NOTICE	337
Ohio law prohibits any person from voting or attempting to	338

shall be imprisoned and additionally may be fined in accordance	341

(X) In all cases of a tie vote or a disagreement in the	343

(X) In all cases of a tie vote or 343 board, if no decision can be arrived at, the director or 344 chairperson shall submit the matter in controversy, not later 345 than fourteen days after the tie vote or the disagreement, to 346 the secretary of state, who shall summarily decide the question, 347 and the secretary of state's decision shall be final. 348

(Y) Assist each designated agency, deputy registrar of 349 motor vehicles, public high school and vocational school, public 350 library, and office of a county treasurer in the implementation 351 of a program for registering voters at all voter registration 352 locations as prescribed by the secretary of state. Under this 353 program, each board of elections shall direct to the appropriate 354 board of elections any voter registration applications for 355 356 persons residing outside the county where the board is located within five days after receiving the applications. 357

(Z) On any day on which an elector may vote in person at 358 the office of the board or at another site designated by the 359 board, consider the board or other designated site a polling 360 place for that day. All requirements or prohibitions of law that 361 apply to a polling place shall apply to the office of the board 362 or other designated site on that day. 363

(AA) Perform any duties with respect to voter registration 364 and voting by uniformed services and overseas voters that are 365 advisories of the secretary of state.

(BB) Establish and maintain a permanent absent voter list 368 of all the registered electors in the county who have opted to 369 be placed on the permanent absent voter list, including written_ 370 applications to be removed from the permanent absent voter list. 371

Sec. 3503.14. (A) The secretary of state shall prescribe 372 the form and content of the registration, change of residence, 373 and change of name forms used in this state. The forms shall 374 meet the requirements of the National Voter Registration Act of 375 1993 and shall include spaces for all of the following: 376

- (1) The voter's name; 377 (2) The voter's address; 378 (3) The current date; 379
- (4) The voter's date of birth; 380
 - (5) The voter to provide one or more of the following: 381 382
 - (a) The voter's driver's license number, if any;

(b) The last four digits of the voter's social security 383 number, if any; 384

(c) A copy of a current and valid photo identification, a 385 copy of a military identification, or a copy of a current 386 utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or 387 other government document, other than a notice of voter 388 registration mailed by a board of elections under section 389 3503.19 of the Revised Code, that shows the voter's name and 390 address. 391

(C) Except as provided in section 3501.382 of the Revised 426 Code, any applicant who is unable to sign the applicant's own 427 name shall make an "X," if possible, which shall be certified by 428 the signing of the name of the applicant by the person filling 429 out the form, who shall add the person's own signature. If an 430 applicant is unable to make an "X," the applicant shall indicate 431 in some manner that the applicant desires to register to vote or 432 to change the applicant's name or residence. The person 433 registering the applicant shall sign the form and attest that 434 the applicant indicated that the applicant desired to register 435 to vote or to change the applicant's name or residence. 436

(D) No registration, change of residence, or change of
name form shall be rejected solely on the basis that a person
registering an applicant failed to sign the person's name or
failed to name the employer who is employing that person to
register the applicant as required under division (A) of this
section.

(E) A voter registration application submitted online
through the internet pursuant to section 3503.20 of the Revised
Code is not required to contain a signature to be considered
valid. The signature obtained under division (B) of that section
shall be considered the applicant's signature for all election

and signature-matching purposes.

(F) As used in this section, "registering an applicant" 449 includes any effort, for compensation, to provide voter 450 registration forms or to assist persons in completing or 451 returning those forms. 452

Sec. 3503.20. (A) The secretary of state shall establish a 453 secure online voter registration system. The system shall 454 455 provide for all of the following:

(1) An applicant to submit a voter registration 456 application to the secretary of state online through the 457 458 internet;

(2) The online applicant to be registered to vote, if all of the following apply:

(a) The application contains all of the following information:

(i) The applicant's name;

(ii) The applicant's address;

(iii) The applicant's date of birth;

(iv) The last four digits of the applicant's social 466 security number; 467

(v) The applicant's Ohio driver's license number or the 468 number of the applicant's state identification card issued under 469 section 4507.50 of the Revised Code. 470

(b) The applicant's name, address, and date of birth, the 471 last four digits of the applicant's social security number, and 472 the applicant's Ohio driver's license number or the number of 473 the applicant's state identification card as they are provided 474

That electronic signature shall be 489 used as the applicant's or elector's signature on voter 490 registration records, for all election and signature-matching 491 purposes. 492

(C) The secretary of state shall employ whatever security493measures the secretary of state considers necessary to ensure494the integrity and accuracy of voter registration information495submitted electronically pursuant to this section. Errors in496processing voter registration applications in the online system497shall not prevent an applicant from becoming registered or from498voting.499

(D) The online voter registration application under500division (A) of this section shall include the following501language:502

"By clicking the box below, I request to be placed on the 503

permanent absent voter list under section 3509.11 of the Revised 504 Code." 505 In order to be placed on the permanent absent voter list 506 under this section, an applicant or elector shall be required to 507 mark the box in the online voter registration application that 508 appears in conjunction with the previous statement. 509 (E) The online voter registration application established 510 under division (A) of this section shall include the following 511 512 language: "By clicking the box below, I affirm all of the following 513 under penalty of election falsification, which is a felony of 514 the fifth degree: 515 (1) I am the person whose name and identifying information 516 is provided on this form, and I desire to register to vote, or 517 update my voter registration, in the State of Ohio. 518 (2) All of the information I have provided on this form is 519 true and correct as of the date I am submitting this form. 520 (3) I am a United States citizen. 521 (4) I will have lived in Ohio for thirty days immediately 522 preceding the next election. 523 (5) I will be at least eighteen years of age on or before 524 the day of the next general election. 525 (6) I authorize the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to transmit 526 to the Ohio Secretary of State my signature that is on file with 527 the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, and I understand and agree that 528 the signature transmitted by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles will 529 be used by the Secretary of State to validate this electronic 530 voter registration application as if I had signed this form 531
