If the Prosecutor's office gives us a legal opinion to discontinue using Paypal until we can go to bid; my proposed solution would be that we continue efilng with the case types we are accepting and discontinue the upfront collection of efiled filing fees. The Judges' could do a miscellaneous order that states something similar to the following:

- The payment of efiled cases are subject to the Deposit/Fee Schedule for the Lake County Clerk of Courts. Payment of fees shall be remitted to the Lake County Clerk of Courts within fourteen (14) days of the initial filing date. Failure to remit such payment could result in your case being dismissed.
